
Applying for Financial Aid Online

We encourage all students to apply for Financial Aid. The application(s) will determine a student's eligibility for grants and loans. Below are instructions on how to apply for financial aid. Our Office is open 9-5 Monday thru Friday to help students and parents file for financial Aid.

Step 1. Create a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) – The student and parents each need their own FSA ID.

** One per email. The FSA ID is comprised of a username and password and can be used to login to certain Federal Student Aid websites, such as the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You can create your ID at https://studentaid.gov

Call 1-800-4-FED-AID (1-800-433-3243) for help.



Step 2. APPLY FOR 2024-2025 FAFSA (Fall 2024 Start) - <u>FAFSA</u> or Free application For Federal Student Aid is a part of the U.S. Department of Education, it is free for any student wishing to find out if they qualify for grants and loans. The website is <u>https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa</u>. Five Towns College **school code is 012561**. When getting ready to apply it is recommended that you have your 2022 Federal tax return and W-2s. Log in with the Student's FSA ID that you created.



Step 3. Applying for TAP. New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) helps eligible <u>New York</u> residents only pay tuition at approved schools in New York State. There are two ways to apply for TAP.

1st way to apply for TAP is directly from the FAFSA site by using the following link you will see on the last page of your completed FAFSA. Be sure to have your State taxes available.



This will take you to the NYS TAP website where you will either create a new account for first time users or returning users can put in their user id that they have already created.

2nd way is to go directly to the TAP website <u>www.hesc.ny.gov</u> and either hover over pay and click Apply for tap or click the link on the landing page.



Step 4. Applying for ETA: The Enhanced Tuition Awards (ETA) program provides tuition awards to students who are New York State residents attending a participating private college located in New York State. Recipients will receive \$6,000 through a combination of their TAP award, ETA award and a match from their private college. Once available, apply at <u>www.hesc.ny.gov</u> Click link to sign up for the Alert on when the 2024-25 application becomes available at <u>https://www.hesc.ny.gov/pay-for-college</u>

**Application won't be available until approximately May 2024 and close in August 2024 **

Step 5. Students who will be taking loans: All students that wish to borrow federal student loans while attending Five Towns College are required to complete online Entrance Loan Counseling, Master Promissory Note . Entrance Counseling is a quiz that educates students regarding their rights and responsibilities of borrowing loans and offers valuable information on the available repayment and deferment options for borrowers. The Master Promissory Note is a legal document in which you promise to repay your loan(s) and any accrued interest and fees to the U.S. Department of Education. If this is your first time accepting a federal student loan, you are acknowledging that you understand your responsibility to repay your loan. If you have existing federal student loans, you are acknowledging that you understand how much you owe and how much more you can borrow.

Instructions on how to do each are below.

1. Go to <u>https://studentaid.gov/</u>Click Loans and Grants. A drop-down menu will appear with loan links. Here you can find the Master promissory and entrance counseling quiz.
