

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

When I first encountered *Clyde's*, I was struck by Lynn Nottage's brilliant ability to blend humor, pathos, and biting social commentary in a seemingly simple setting—a roadside sandwich shop. Beneath the surface of this intimate, often comic portrayal of daily life, Nottage explores profound questions of redemption, second chances, and the human capacity to dream in the face of adversity.

Clyde's is more than just a play about workers in a kitchen. It is a story of resilience, of individuals who have been knocked down by life and are struggling to rise. The characters—people who have paid their debts to society—are trapped again, wrestling with the balance of survival and self-worth. Yet, even in this bleak world, dreams refuse to die, and the simple act of creating the perfect sandwich becomes a metaphor for hope, transformation, and self-expression.

In directing this production, my focus has been on the kitchen rhythms—a world where the mundane becomes a stage for more significant existential struggles. And while Clyde may try to extinguish their hope, it's through their shared humanity, creativity, and mutual support that they find a way to push back against her oppressive control. Nottage's writing is exquisite in its ability to hold a mirror to our world. She challenges us to reflect on our own capacity for judgment, forgiveness, and renewal. What happens when our past mistakes define us? How do we navigate a world that is often unforgiving? And how do we find moments of grace in the chaos? It is my hope that, through *Clyde's*, audiences will not only laugh and reflect but also see the enduring power of hope and creativity in the face of hardship. Sometimes the smallest acts of creation—whether it's crafting the perfect sandwich or reimagining a future for oneself—can be the most radical forms of resistance. "¡Viva la Resistencia!"


